

BOOTH OS · IPHONE INSTALL

FROM LINK TO APP.

Five taps turn the OS link into an app on the home screen: full screen, monogram icon, and the whole kit working with no signal. Safari does the installing; here is the route.

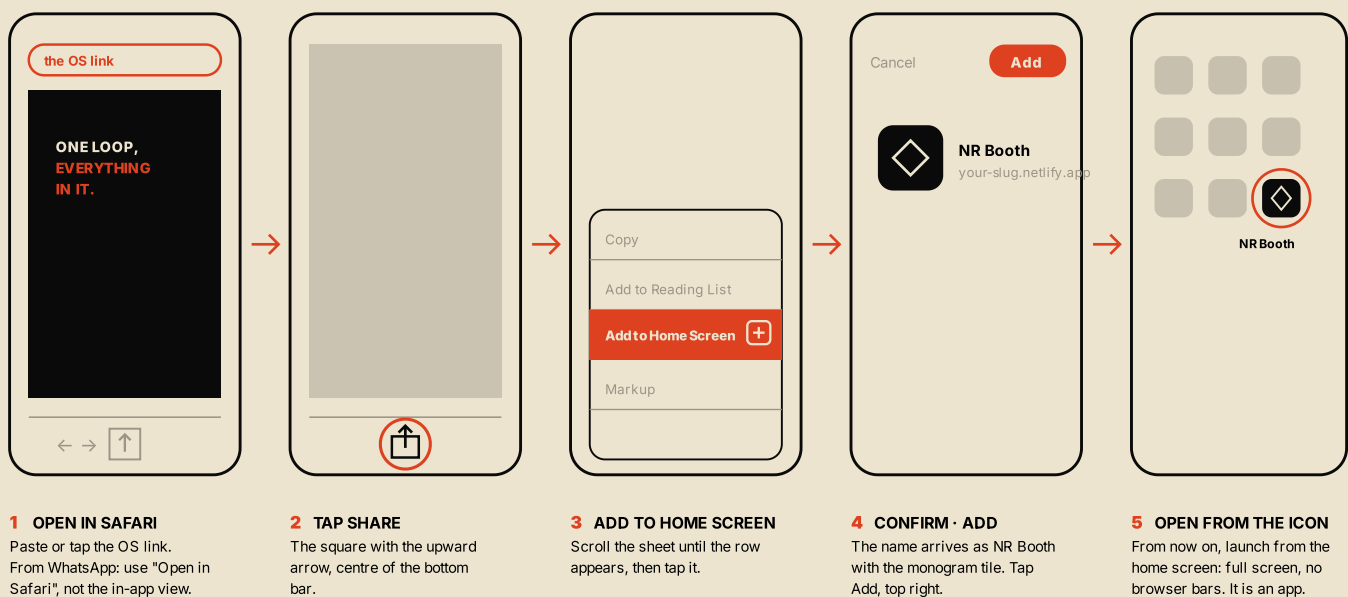


FIG. 1 · THE FIVE TAPS, LEFT TO RIGHT · SAFARI ON IPHONE

01 OFFLINE, AUTOMATICALLY

On the first open, the OS quietly saves the entire kit to the phone: every tool, every document, the narration, even the sample film. When the line "Saved for offline" appears under the title, it is done, and everything opens with no signal, which matters downstairs. No setting to find, no button to press.

02 UPDATES ARRIVE ON THE SECOND OPEN

When a new build is deployed, an installed phone shows it on the second open, not the first: the first visit downloads the new version in the background while showing the saved one. Seeing yesterday's version once is the update working, not failing.

03 ANDROID AND DESKTOP, FOR COMPLETENESS

Chrome on Android offers "Add to Home screen" from the three-dot menu, with the same result. On a computer, the OS is simply a website at the same link; installing is not required to use it.
